15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> College offers courses in Arts, Science and Commerce & Management faculties. The college is affiliated to MLSU. Environmental studies, Elementary Computer, General Hindi and General English are compulsory for the students of all faculties in College. This paper helps the students to acquire knowledge of environment and computer technology. At the post graduate level, M.Sc (Maths) and M.Sc (Chemistry) CBCS credit based course is being run. Project work in BCA and assignment/internal exam in BBA is

mandatory part of curriculum.

- MLSU has approved our faculties of Arts and Science as research supervisor. This information also shared in College prospectus.
- VBRI has started five skill based courses since 22-23 such as retail management, yoga, and website designing etc. These courses are mandatory for all first year students. These courses will enhance the employability of students.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The college is not following credit bank pattern. The syllabus for skill based certificate course will be prepared at the college level. Exams for these courses will be conducted at the College level. The students will also be provided with the study material.

17.Skill development:

- Students are involved in the social work through programs such as NSS, Rover etc. In addition to this, students are also connected to social welfare work through Anandam program.
- Vidya Bhawan Society is associated with several progfams such as distribution of masks during corona period, food packet distribution, tree plantation, woolen cloths distribution, providing scholarship to the poor and needy students during covid, wellness facility etc. Vidya Bhawan Society is continuously working on the moral values.
- During classes, Teaching staff members discuss with the students about moral values apart from the study work. Through NSS and Rover units, students are involved in various social activities such as distribution of stationary, masks, providing water facility to school students etc. These activities are being conducted in the adopted village 'Bhilon Ka Bedla'.
- Department of Chemistry is in the process of undergoing MOU with the Industries. Industrial visits as well as educational tours are also arranged for the students.
- In the skill based certificate course, field visits and expert lectures will be arranged to provide help and guidance to students.
- IGNOU study center is operated in the College, in which students get the facility of online distance learning along with regular degree courses.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

- Most of the students of our institute belong to rural

background so the concepts are explained to them in English, Hindi as well as in local language.

- Every year an annual function is celebrated in which the students are encouraged to perform folk dances and folk songs. They are also encouraged to make rangoli, mehndi, paintings and 'Mandana'.
- The faculty chairman who manages all the work of their respective streams instruct their faculty members in meetings to prepare study material in Hindi as well as in English.
- Hindi and Sanskrit are taught as subjects in the Degree courses and separate teaching faculties are appointed for these subjects. College also run post graduate course in Hindi.
- Sanskrit is taught as a subject in the College at Undergraduate level. Every year Hindi and Sanskrit week is celebrated in which students are given expert/ guest lectures in hindi, knowledge testing competitions, dictations in hindi and Sanskrit are taken. Students are motivated to express their views in these languages. Essay writing and pronunciation of shlokas is also taught to students.
- Every year college organizes various competitions on Mehndi, Rangoli, Painting, Dance (Solo and group dance), and Song (solo and group song) for students. Sports activities on kho kho, kabaddi, hockey and archery are also conducted every year.

To promote outcome based education (OBE), college conducts unit tests and internal exams. Assignments and case study is also given to students and on the basis of this the level of knowledge acquired by the students is tested. The teaching plan is also prepared by keeping in mind the result of last year's performance. The study material and notes is also shared to students in their groups.

The Context:-Vidya Bhawan has started Covid- 19 scholarship for students to help them continue their education. The main reason is to check the dropout in education in Covid- period due to financial problems.

The Practice: - Most of the students belong to rural areas and their financial condition is poor. It is very difficult to provide all of them this scholarship. Our limitation is to do screening to provide this scholarship.

Evidence of success: - After screening we have given scholarship to 28 students. Total 190560/- amount was released in Covid -19 scholarship.

Problems Encountered and Resource Required: - The arrangement of funds and screening process is challengeable but we efficiently did these tasks.
